Loans Available to improve quality child care in Minneapolis

Are you a family child care provider who...

- Is located in the City of Minneapolis?
- Has a household income that qualifies as low income, or has enrollment in which 50% of the children you serve receive child care subsidies or qualify as low-income
- Owns and operate a child care home located in Minneapolis
- Is licensed for at least 6 months and license is in good
- Is committed to improve the quality of your child care space and program?

If you answered yes to these questions, you may be eligible for a Renovation Loan.

Renovation loans of up to \$15,000 to improve the quality of child care environment are available to eligible Minneapolis licensed family child care providers.

Renovation Program Priorities:

- Reducing environmental health hazards
- Satisfying a citation from the City of Minneapolis
- Satisfying a correction order from a licensor
- Addressing safety issues
- Improving the quality of licensed space
- Expansion of licensed space

Loans will not be provided for room additions.

Providers must have, or be willing to purchase, child care liability insurance.
